The Temptation of Christ

- Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, Luke 4:1-13
- Sin nature: Genesis 2:15-17, Romans 5:9-21, Hebrews 2:14-18, 4:15
- Why these three?
 - o Not by bread, but by Scripture empty life is living death!
 - o Not to tempt God, presume on Him (in spite of our own actions/attitudes)
 - o Not to worship other Gods all others satanic/demonic in origin, contrary to God

First recorded miracle of Christ – John 2:1-12; Water into wine – primary Catholic justification for prayer through Mary.

Jesus and Nicodemus

John 3:1-2 Jesus (Rabbi, from God), Nicodemus (handout), plural verb – representing a group – does not verbalize a question...

Nicodemus was looking for spiritual things from God

Looking for Messiah (Matthew 11:2-6) Isaiah 35:5-6, 61:1

Looking for 'that' prophet Deuteronomy 18:18-19

Looking for the new covenant Jeremiah 31:31-34

John 3:3 Jesus – You must be born again

Focus change from Jesus to Nicodemus, individually, not as representative

(Because the spiritual kingdom is personal, always personal)

Nicodemus could have related spiritual birth to Ezekiel 36:26-27

(difference from Jeremiah passage is Spirit, not just knowledge)

John 3:4-6

Nicodemus – I don't understand

Jesus John 3:7-8 You can't understand

Nicodemus (thinks of Proverbs 30:4) Jesus is claiming deity, vs 9

Jesus John 3:10-13 Jesus is claiming deity and messiahship (Daniel 7:13-14)

Numbers 21:1-9 (Story of the fiery serpents)

John 3:14-16

As Israelites had to look to the serpents,

Nicodemus must TRUST Jesus

but have everlasting live.

– John 3:16, KJV

For God so loved the

world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that

whosoever believeth in

Him should not perish,

Nicodemus knows about righteousness by faith

Abraham Genesis 15:1-6, he knew about Noah, Joshua & Caleb, David

...but Jesus made it personal! (History tells us he put his faith in Jesus Christ)
