Other Beliefs

Limbus Infantum - In Catholicism, "edge, infants", aka **Limbo** – where unbaptized infants go – neither tormented or allowed into heaven.

Based on doctrine of baptismal regeneration, not based on Protestant cannon Scripture

Purgatory – also Catholic in origin, "to purge" – canonical Scriptures all grossly misinterpreted by natural context. Primary passage II Maccabees 12:41-45 – sin offering and prayers for those who had died in sin.

Note on Maccabees: Occurs during the time between the Testaments, never classed as scriptural by Jews.

Guardian Angels – Primary Scripture of direct association of individuals with guardian angels is Matthew 18:10. Otherwise, there are several verses of acts of angels protecting in various ways (saving Lot, rescuing Peter from prison, etc.)

Much more established in Rabbinic literature and Catholic tradition, but also a concept in Eastern non-Christian religions.

The Dead becoming Angels – Emanuel Swedenborg (1688-1772) taught as doctrine no created angels, but only dead humans – good and evil. This is also popularized by the 1946 classic movie, It's a Wonderful Life, and by children's cartoons which have used transformation into angelic or devilish forms as an onscreen euphemism for death.

Not helping the confusion is the fact that the Bible does not relate the creations of angels per se.
