

Kings & Prophets – Intro

The Story of David

Chronological Notes: (All years and ages are best guess)

1. Saul begins to reign and David is born 1040 BC
2. Jonathan's success in battle (age 20)
3. God rejects Saul as king, David anointed (age 14-15) 1025 BC
4. David serves (on occasion) as a musician for Saul (age 55-65)
5. David slays Goliath (age 15-18), friendship with Jonathan (age 35-40)
6. David becomes Armor Bearer to Saul (or earlier, if honorary/comradary)
7. David marries Saul's daughter, Michal, commands 1,000 men (age 25)
8. David's years of outlaw/ exile, complete with his personal army
9. Death of Samuel, and then Saul and Jonathan, David king of Judah
In 1000 BC, David is about age 40.
10. David king of Israel within 3 years, reigns until 961 BC, dies age 70-75

I Samuel 16:1-13	Anointing of David
I Samuel 16:14-23	David and Saul at first
I Samuel 17	David and Goliath
I Samuel 18:1-4	Heir acknowledges him, defers kingdom to him
I Samuel 18:5	David's new leadership accepted
I Samuel 18:6-9	People celebrate David as a great war hero
I Samuel 18:10-15	Given a unit of 1,000 soldiers
I Samuel 18:16	People still celebrate David as a great war hero
I Samuel 18:17-19	David becomes Saul's son-in-law
I Samuel 18:30	Continued victory against Philistines
I Samuel Chapters 20-27+	Saul chases David, David maintains an army 1K dims to 6C.
I Samuel 25:1, Ch 28, 31	Death of Samuel, and then Saul and Jonathan
II Samuel 1:1-5:16	David king of Judah (est. 1000 BC), king of Israel within 3 years. David is age 30 (2 Samuel 5:4).
2 Samuel 7:8+	Davidic Covenant
2 Samuel 5:17-10:19	David finally conquers all of the Promised Land, largest kingdom in the history of Israel – tremendous wealth and power – enemies under tribute.
2 Samuel 23:8-39	(Of special note: vs 8-12, 18, 20-21, 39)
2 Samuel 11:1-12:23, 24-25	David and Bathsheba, birth of Solomon
2 Samuel 13:1-19:7	Rebellion of 3 rd son Absalom – attempt to usurp David
1 Kings 1:1-2:12	David sets up Solomon as king, death of David age 70

Wives and Sons of David

Michal, daughter of Saul, 1Sam18:26

She died childless, 2Sam6:23. Her 'five sons' of 2Sam21:8 belonged to Adriel.

Ahinoam, the Jezreelitess 1Chr3:1

Son #1 = Amnon, the rapist, 2Sam13:14

Abigail, the Carmelitess, formerly the wife of Nabal, 1Sam25:3. A wise woman.

Son #2 = Daniel (or Chileab) 1Chr3:1

Maachah, daughter of Talmai, king of Geshur

Son #3 = **Absalom** - 2Sam18:14-18

Haggith - mother of Adonijah

Son #4 = Adonijah "son of Haggith"

Abital - wife number six, apparently

Son #5 = Shephatiah

Eglah - wife number seven

Son #6 = Ithream "these six were born unto him in Hebron..." 1Chr3:4

Bathsheba (or Bathshua, 1Chr3:5) - wife #8

In Jerusalem

#7 = Shimea, - #8 = Shobab

#9 = Nathan - #10 = **Solomon**

#11 = Ibhar - #12 = Elishua

#13 = Eliphelet - #14 = Nogah - 2Sam5:15

Twenty (20) sons of David, not including those of concubines, and not including his daughter Tamar.
1Chr3:9 or his other sons and daughters.

#15 = Nepheg - #16 = Japhia - 1Chr3:5

#17 = Elishama - #18 = Eliadah

#19=Eliphelet #20=Jerimoth, 2Chr11:18
