

Deportation of Judah


627-580 Jeremiah

609 Jehoiakim begins reign, Habakkuk begins ministry

605 BC Babylon invades Judah, 1st deportation includes Daniel

597 BC Babylon captures Judah, 2nd deportation includes Ezekiel, Zedekiah begins reign

586 BC Babylon destroys Jerusalem and the temple, 3rd deportation



Habakkuk – Interview with God

1:1-4 Habakkuk complains of Evil in Judah

1:5-11 (5-7) God answers with promise of judgment via the Chaldeans (S. Babylonians)

1:12-2:1 (12-13) How can God use greater evil to punish lesser evil?

2:2-20 (2:2, 12, 15, 19-20) Chaldeans also to be punished Righteous to flee, to live by faith, to be protected by God

3:2, 16-18

Jeremiah and Zedekiah Jeremiah 34:1-6, 38:17-28

Jeremiah respected by Nebuchadnezzar 39:11-12

Jeremiah warns vs flight to Egypt, God's offer of restoration 42:7-18

The End (not really)

(2 Kings 23:34-36 Pharaoh Neco replaces Jehoahaz with Jehoiakim – 605-597 BC)

2 Kings 24:6-7, 8a, 9 Jehoiachin's brief reign

2 Kings 24:10-17 First deportation, Zedekiah made king

2 Kings 24:18a, 19a, 20b Zedekiah's rebellion

2 Kings 25:1-7 Second deportation, Zedekiah defeated

2 Kings 25:8-12 Destruction of Jerusalem, 3rd deportation, remnant left behind

2 Kings 25:8-12, 18-19, 21 Kingless leadership is the high priest and king's cabinet

2 Kings 25:22, 25-26 Last of the leadership flees to Egypt

2 King 25:27-30 Zedekiah's predecessor, Jehoiachin, restored somewhat in Babylon
