
Old Testament Sacrifice and Worship Feasts and Holy Days

Schedule of Sacrifices (Leviticus 23, Deuteronomy 16)

1. Daily Offerings – Morning and Evening
2. Sabbath Day Offerings
3. New Moon Offerings
4. Feasts Below

March / April

1. Passover – 14th of Nisan (Abib)
 - a. Deuteronomy 16:1-8
 - b. Passover (Paschal) lamb
 - c. Purging leaven
2. Unleavened Bread – 15th of Nisan
 - a. Deuteronomy 16:2-3
 - b. Burnt and Meal Offering
 - c. eat no leaven for 7 days
3. First-Fruits – 1st Sunday after Passover
 - a. Leviticus 23:9-14
 - b. Burnt, Meal, and Drink Offering
 - c. First Fruits to temple, p/o sacrifice

June

4. Feast of weeks – 50 days after First-Fruits
 - a. Deuteronomy 16 :7-12
 - b. Burnt and Sin Offerings
 - c. Two loaves of leavened, wheat bread as Wave offering

September / October

5. Feast of Trumpets (Rosh Hashanah) – 1st day of Tishri
 - a. Leviticus 23:23-25
 - b. Burnt, Meal, and Sin Offerings
 - c. Blowing of Trumpets (shofar)
6. Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur) – 10th of Tishri
 - a. Leviticus 23:26-32
 - b. Burnt, Meal, and Sin Offerings
 - c. Only day High Priest could enter Holy of Holies
7. Feast of Tabernacles (Booths) – 15th-21st of Tishri
 - a. Leviticus 23:39-44
 - a. Burnt and Sin Offerings
 - b. Built huts and “camped” in them

What about...?

1. Hanukkah (Festival of Lights)
 - d. Dedication of 2nd Temple – Maccabean Revolt (after Malachi, before Matthew)
 - e. 8 Days, usu. Dec
2. Purim
 - d. Mordecai and Esther save Persian Jews from genocide (Esther 9:22)
 - e. Mid-March
